



JAZZMADRID21 International Festival

November in Madrid will play out to a soundtrack of jazz as the city hosts the JAZZMADRID21 International Festival. Held until the 30th, the event will feature performances by **prominent international figures as well as seasoned and emerging jazz artists from Spain**. The official programme will take place at three municipal cultural centres: **Fernán Gómez - Centro Cultural de la Villa, CentroCentro and CondeDuque**, as well as **other venues and institutions around Madrid**: the National Music Auditorium, the National Library, Círculo de Bellas Artes, Institut Français, the Polish Institute of Culture, La Noche en Vivo and Teatro Pavón, which will feature a new series called "Villanos del Jazz" (Jazz Villains). In addition to offering a range of music events encompassing styles like **flamenco jazz and adventurous jazz**, this edition of the festival **will pay tribute to jazz greats who have left us recently** (Pedro Iturralde and Chick Corea). It will also include **parallel activities** such as an exhibition of photos by Jaime Massieu and film screenings at Cineteca film archive and Institut Français, as well as talks by jazz professionals and scholars.

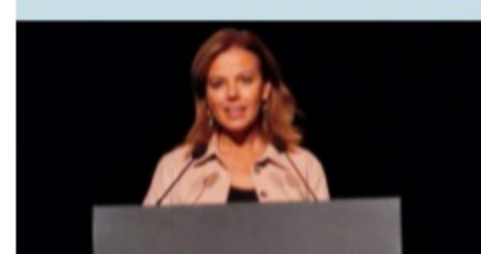

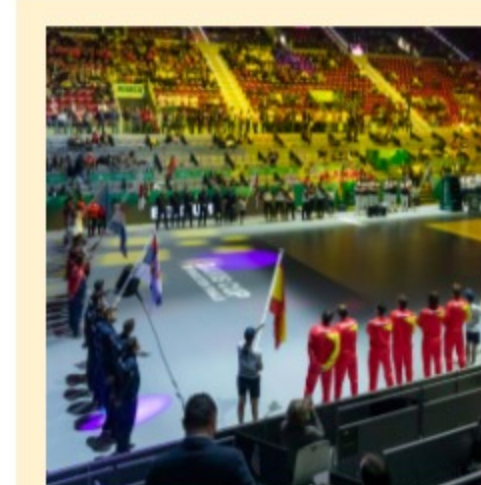


Madrid, shortlisted for the Condé Nast Traveller Middle East Readers' Choice Awards 2021

Davis Cup by Rakuten Madrid Finals

It also features the Horse Show, which will include various activities and shows as well as 90 sales stands, a gourmet food corner, games for kids and the classic Pony Park.

Velázquez's Las Meninas, an iconic work in terms of both art and culture, and one that is more closely tied to Madrid than almost any other, will be returning to the city's streets. Until 15 December, the fourth edition of this initiative will showcase new sculptures customised by visual artists, chefs and athletes. This time, in honour of the Jacobean Year, a pilgrim Menina has been created. Each figure has a QR code that explains the piece and presents it virtually.
